Carbon monoxide alarms save lives

**A WORKING CARBON MONOXIDE
ALARM CAN DETECT CARBON
MONOXIDE IN YOUR HOME AND WILL
WARN YOU AND YOUR FAMILY.**

Over 65% of all carbon monoxide deaths and injuries in Ontario occur in homes.

Known as the "silent killer", CO is a poisonous gas that you cannot see, smell, or taste.

The below fuel-burning appliances can produce CO in your home:

- Fireplace
- Gas dryer
- Furnace
- Stove
- Water heater
- Portable fuel heater

DID YOU KNOW?



CO alarms are not a substitute for smoke alarms

PROTECT YOUR FAMILY.

- Exposure to CO can cause flu-like symptoms.
- Ensure all fuel-burning appliances and vents are inspected annually.
- Install CO alarms on every floor of the home if it has a fuel-burning appliance, fireplace, or attached garage.
- Test CO alarms monthly and change batteries at least once a year.
- If your CO alarm sounds, get out immediately and seek medical help to check for CO poisoning.
